#### Tag or Memo

Some exchanges and platforms require an extra identifier so deposits are credited correctly.

#### Fee

A small network fee is charged when sending transactions.

#### Reserve

Some XRP must remain in a wallet to keep it active, depending on current network rules and wallet structure.

### Common Use Cases

- Sending XRP between wallets
- Moving value between exchanges
- Holding XRP as a long-term asset
- Using XRP within broader crypto portfolio strategies
- Exploring payment and liquidity narratives in digital finance

### Example: First XRP Transfer

1. Open the receiving wallet and copy the XRP address.
2. Check whether a destination tag is required.
3. Paste the address carefully into the sending platform.
4. Send a small test amount first.
5. Confirm the transaction before moving a larger balance.

## What New Users Often Get Wrong

- Forgetting to check for a destination tag
- Sending on the wrong network or to the wrong address
- Moving a large amount before testing
- Leaving funds on exchanges without understanding custody risk
- Confusing XRP the asset with every company or product discussed around it

## XRP and Volatility

Like other crypto assets, XRP can move in price quickly. Anyone buying, holding, or transferring XRP should understand that market price, regulation, liquidity, and investor sentiment can all affect outcomes.

## Security Basics

- Use a reputable wallet
- Enable strong security on devices and exchange accounts
- Double-check every address and tag
- Avoid phishing links and fake support accounts
- Consider hardware wallet storage for larger balances
